The information sheets in this release was designed and produced with Technical Assistance from UNFPA in collaboration with Professional Staff of FBoS. The following outputs are presented;





















Description

Percentage by town







Business & Housing Fig: 12 Central / Eastern - Urban





Description

- The labour force is made up of those engaged in Paid or Unpaid work or are Unemployed. The Unemployed are those who are
 available or looking for work.
- Urban dwellers engaged in money work activities accounted for 84.2% of the labour force with Korovou at 87.4% followed by Suya at 86.3%
- The highest unemployment rate was recoded at Deuba at 11.6% followed by Nasinu 6.7% and Korovou at 6.0%.
- Participation for subsistence was the highest for Levuka at 12.5% while Suva recorded the lowest at 3%
- The labour force participation rate was highest for Levuka at 60.3% while Suva recorded the rate of 52.2%
 - Those outside the Labour Force (OLF) are made up of students, retirees, full-time home workers and those not looking for work.





- The labour force is made up of those engaged in Paid or Unpaid work or are Unemployed. The Unemployed are those who are
 available or looking for work
- Urban dwellers engaged in money work activities accounted for 80.0% of the labour force with Savusavu at 92% followed by Labasa (78.6%).
- The highest unemployment rate was recoded at Seagaga at 5.6%. and followed by Labasa at 1.7%.
- Participation for subsistence was the highest for Nabouwalu at 23.9% while Savusavu recorded the lowest at 4.5%
- The labour force participation rate was highest for Nabouwalu at 64.7 while Seagaga recorded the rate of 48.6%.
- Those outside the Labour Force (OLF) are made up of students, retirees, full-time home workers and those not looking for work.




