2015-16 Employment and Unemployment Survey Release 2

Money Work, Formal and Informal Sector Employment

Survey findings contained in this release are based on information reported by a representative sample of 5,000 households. The details represent the situation in the estimated 186,236 conventional households in Fiji where 856,325 persons live. Persons living in Non-Private Dwellings such as Boarding Schools, Hospitals, Prisons, Work Site Accommodation and Single Officers Barracks were excluded from the survey.

The release contains employment estimates of the formal and informal sector with the following breakdown;

- 1) Formal and Informal Employment by Industry
- 2) Formal and Informal Sector Employment by Occupation Sex
- 3) Formal and Informal Sector Employment by Industry by Sex
- 4) Formal and Informal Sector Employment by Occupation and Industry by Sex

1.0 Money Work

A total of 263,463 persons aged 15 and over were earning money through the sale of goods and services or were engaged in paid employment.

The dominant Industry Groups in terms of employment numbers were;

- 1) Wholesale and Retail Trade 45,792 money earners accounting for 17.4% of the total.
- 2) Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries 45,482 money earners accounting for 17.3% of the total.
- 3) Construction 23,293 money earners accounting for 8.9% of the total.
- 4) Manufacturing 21,444 money earners accounting for 8.2% of the total.
- 5) Accommodation and Food Service 19,151 money earners accounting for 7.3% of the total.

The majority (57.8%) of those Employed in Money Earning activities are Urban Dwellers while Males account for around two thirds of these workers.

2.0 Formal and Informal Sector Breakdown

Money workers who contributed to the Fiji National Provident Fund (FNPF) were included in the Formal Sector.

The Formal Sector accounted for 64.6% of persons engaged in money work. The top three Formal Sector industries in terms of employment numbers are as follows;

- 1) Wholesale and Retail Trade with 32,937 workers.
- 2) Manufacturing with 18,671 workers.
- 3) Public Administration and Defence with 17,289 workers.

The Informal Sector accounted for 35.4% of persons engaged in money work. The top three Informal Sector industries in terms of employment numbers are as follows;

- 1) Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing with 38,887 workers.
- 2) Wholesale and Retail Trade with 12,911 workers.
- 3) Construction with 10,703 workers.

4.0 Formal Sector Employment by Major Occupation and Broad Industry Groups

Table 4.0 on the following page presents the distribution of Money Workers in the Formal Sector by Major Occupation and Broad Industry Grouping. The top three Occupation Groups in terms of employment numbers is as follows;

- 1) Services and Sales with 44,897 workers.
- 2) Craft and Related Trade with 37,065 workers.
- 3) Skilled Agricultural, Forestry and Fishery with 36,607 workers.

Close to three quarters of the workers are engaged in activities grouped under the Broad Industry Category of Services, which also accounted for 84.1% of Female workers.

5.0 Informal Sector Employment by Major Occupation and Broad Industry Groups

Table 5.0 on Page 7 presents the distribution of Money Workers in the Informal Sector by Major Occupation and Broad Industry Grouping. The top three Occupation Groups in terms of employment numbers is as follows;

- 4) Skilled Agricultural, Forestry and Fisheries with 31,888 workers.
- 5) Elementary Occupations with 19,952 workers.
- 6) Craft and Related Trade with 14,639 workers.

The majority (43.8%) of workers in the informal sector are engaged in activities grouped under the Broad Industry Category of Services, which also accounted for 71.9% of Female workers.
